### Introduction

The <u>Collaboration on Social Science and Immunisation (COSSI)</u> is a collective of researchers, healthcare professionals, people working in immunisation policy and practice, and consumer representatives who work collaboratively to improve vaccine acceptance and uptake.

COSSI was established by the National Centre for Immunisation Research and Surveillance (NCIRS) and the University of Sydney in 2016.

### What does COSSI do?

The aim of COSSI is to better inform Australian immunisation policy and practice with highquality evidence from the social sciences.

The objectives of the network are to:

- facilitate communication and collaboration between those working in the social science of immunisation
- share research and findings
- build capacity in research, evaluation and translation.

COSSI activities include regular knowledge exchange meetings, seminars/webinars, and occasional in-person meetings and workshops. Members can also communicate with each other via the COSSI email list, which currently has 301 members.

### **Updating COSSI's governance**

### **NSW Health Behavioural Science and Health Communication Advisory Group**

• Date: Ongoing

Description: In December 2021, the NSW Ministry of Health established a
Behavioural Science and Communications Advisory Group to provide advice from
behavioural science and health communication experts to inform and optimise
initiatives managed by the Population and Public Health Division of the Ministry.

The Group, which was chaired by Dr Kerry Chant, had the aim of providing a forum for policy teams to seek expert advice on new and emerging evidence and its implications for population health policies and programs.

The Ministry invited COSSI members Katrina Clark, Maryke Steffens, Kasia Bolsewicz and Julie Leask to contribute expert advice on respiratory illness and vaccination behavioural insights, including relating to paediatric influenza vaccines.

### **COSSI Student and Early Career Researchers Network event**

• Date: 19 June 2023

 Description: The COSSI Student and Early Career Researchers Network held an inaugural free, multi-faceted event during the Communicable Diseases and Immunisation Conference (CDIC) 2023 in Perth.

Mid- and late-career researchers in the field shared general advice before partaking in group and one-on-one mentoring sessions with early career researchers, discussing and advising on many issues pertaining to professional, academic and professional growth in the field.

# Selected policy engagement

A meeting took place with representatives of the Australian Government regarding the work of COSSI, and input was given regarding the Australian Centre for Disease Control (CDC).

Margie Danchin, Kerrie Wiley, Katie Attwell, Julie Leask, Catherine King, Emma Campbell, Jane Frawley and Nicole Batten either participated in this work or represented COSSI in discussion with Jacob Madden of the Commonwealth CDC establishment team (Department of Health and Aged Care) on 14 November 2023.

The purpose of the meeting was to allow the COSSI team to:

- provide input on approaches to social science in public health
- offer insights into functional considerations for inclusion of social science in CDC decision processes and governance, based on COSSI research into international best practice examples.

The COSSI team outlined the project undertaken to inform inclusion of social science in the structure of the CDC, in which data were triangulated across three main areas: a scoping review of global best practice and review of grey literature pertaining to other Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) countries' CDCs or similar organisations, key informant interviews to understand the CDCs' structure and function, and how social science is used to inform decision-making in the relevant countries.

The key informant interviews provide perspectives from international academic and government professionals involved in pandemic public health responses.



These data, which have previously been utilised in relevant consultations in 19 OECD countries, will help to inform the proposed structure and ensure the Australian CDC aligns with global best practice.
